March 8-10, 1995, Fleet 4 Lake Eustis Sailing Club, Florida

Wednesday morning all of Central Florida was under a tornado alert. The regatta committee assured everyone that it would be possible to get two of the three scheduled races in after lunch. Happy Fox, with his portable weather radio to his ear, said it all when he declared "if the national weather station removes the tornado alert, I'll go out but not until then." When the alert was lifted it took the wind with it and what was remaining took a 100 degree shift just as the first race was to begin. By the time the course was adjusted, only enough daylight remained to complete one race which Doug McNeil won after a long battle with John Adams.

Thursday dawned to a forecasted 15-20 MPH wind out of the NE with temperatures in the low 60's. Four races were completed over a shortened Olympic course. In the 3rd race of the day, Andy Burdick put on a sparkling display of his championship sailing ability. After jumping the gun and weaving his way through the fleet back to the starting line, he restarted in last place several minutes behind the entire fleet. It was a spectators delight to watch him skillfully work his way back into contention to a strong 4th place. Andy did not lose, he just ran out of time. While Andy was doing his thing, others were capsizing all over the course and Tim Fredman had the misfortune to have his mast fall when the forestay pin slipped out (what price a bit of tape?). Jim Hauser of the new Lake Norman, NC fleet took the days honor by capsizing three times. The next day, Jim Apollonio of Diamond Lake, Michigan tied Houser's record but went him one better by swamping twice.

Friday brought more of the 15-20 MPH NE stuff with temperatures in the mid to high 60's. Two more of the shortened Olympic course races were completed with Andy accumulating two more bullets.

Doug McNeil and son pressed Andy every race, winning two and was the top amateur with an overall second place. An outstanding regatta was sailed by Duane and Irene Pierson sailing old #500, the Pickle. They were 6th overall, 3rd amateur and first grand master. Ron Stryker, sailing single handed throughout, finished 7th overall, 4th amateur and 1st master, just four points behind Duane. Suzi Reese with daughter Kelly sailed a consistent regatta (though not good enough to satisfy her own high standards) to finish 10th overall, 7th amateur and 1st woman.

Although temperatures were not the hoped for 70's, the winds left nothing to be desired, particularly if you brought along a crew or were lucky enough to find one. Doug McNeil could have auctioned his three sons to the highest bidders!

Set aside March 6-8, 1996 and plan to attend the 24th annual Midwinter Championship Regatta on Lake Eustis where you are always assured of weather, many times it is even very pleasant.

Editor's Note: Again this year, great winds at Lake Eustis. Dinner at Vic's Embers and Frank Vandall's after-dinner remarks were excellent.
