## 2015 Diamond Lake MC Regatta

The Club held our ANNUAL this past weekend. The event started with a cocktail party on Friday night to welcome the visiting sailors. The MC Fleet and visitors would like to thank the members for the hospitality and warm welcome. The hors d'oeuvres were great, thank you. On Saturday eleven visiting sailors and nine Diamond Lake sailors were on the starting line for the first race start at 10:30 AM. The wind was oscillating and gusts reached 12 mph for a first leg which saw the fleet split and work both sides of the lake. Several individual battles took place and by the finish Stewart Struthers beat our Jim Engels with Bill Farabaugh third.

The wind cooperated by holding at SSW and we were able to start Race Two. The fleet stayed together on Starboard to the island and tacked back across the lake then the leaders took control of the race.

Some of race one leaders found some holes and found themselves in the back of the pack. Our Jim Hayden did it right and finished seventh beating daughter Sue Loux by a boat length. Good starts were very important in a large fleet. If you are in the second row you can watch the leaders get the wind and increase their leads. Past DLYC champion Richard Blake won this race followed by Stewart Strother and Bill Farabaugh.

Lunch, wind shift, reset course and we were ready for race three. The wind had clocked west and the new course starting line was at the East end of the lake (where the worst of the power boat waves are). The fleet was pushing the line and we had several General Recalls because of too many boats over the starting line at the start. When we got a clean start the sailors split starboard and port tacks and again if you were not on the line you watched the leaders sail away. Some changes in the finishing order were recorded but Richard Blake won again. Richard has great boat handling skills, aggressive starts and the ability to read the wind on the water. Former member John Hans was second by about a boat length and Jack Sanderson was third.

The race committee moved the windward mark for race four. That was a mistake as the fleet made the first mark on one tack and there were no tactics involved on that leg. We set a new mark for the third leg and we had a challenging race. Richard won again with Steve Strother second and our Sue Lox third. The power boat chop was bad and some of those waves can just stop an MC in light air. Thanks to Sue Peterson who asked several wake boarders and tubers to respect the sailors and move away from the race course.

We had wind in the 2-4 mph Sunday and cancelled racing for the day at 11:00 AM so the visiting sailors could pack up and get home. Results below.

It takes a lot people to run a regatta. Michael Schrager and the Peluchiwski family organized the pre regatta work. Austin Francis designed and purchased the trophies. MC Fleet 28 and the visiting sailors would like to thank the race committee, Bob Miller, PRO; Bonnie Hague, Flags and more; Elaine Balok, Photos; Mike Seedorf, windward mark boat; Bob Wurster, safety boat. Registration and scoring was done by Leah and Nick Peluchiwski. The breakfast was set by Sue Loux, the lunches by Jackie Miller, Carol Bieneman, Carole Wurster and the great steak dinner by GeorgieAnn and Bill Peluchiwski. This was another successful regatta for our yacht club. All the visiting sailors plan to be back and bring more MC sailors.
